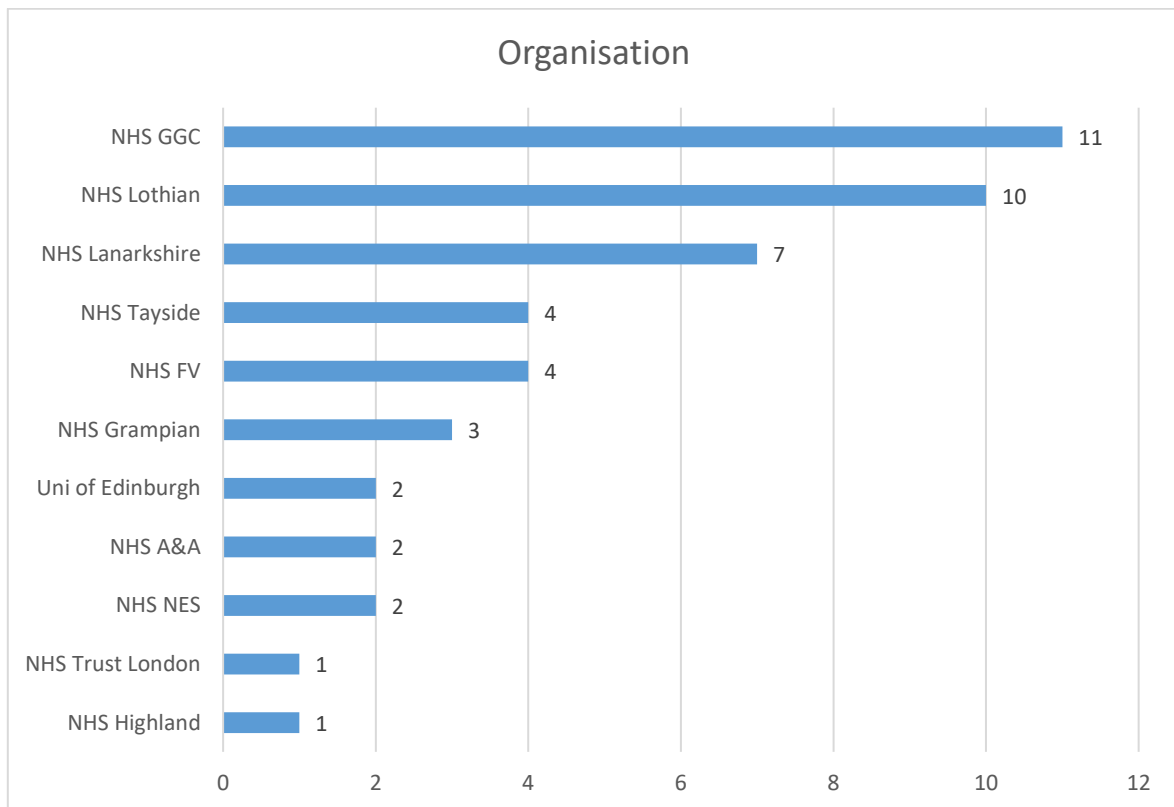


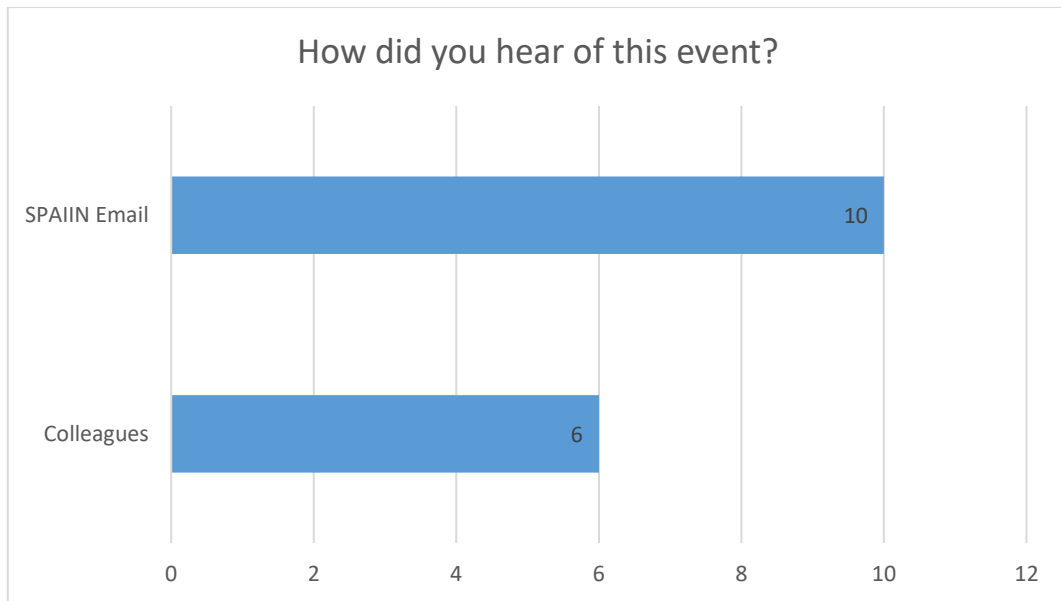
Attendees



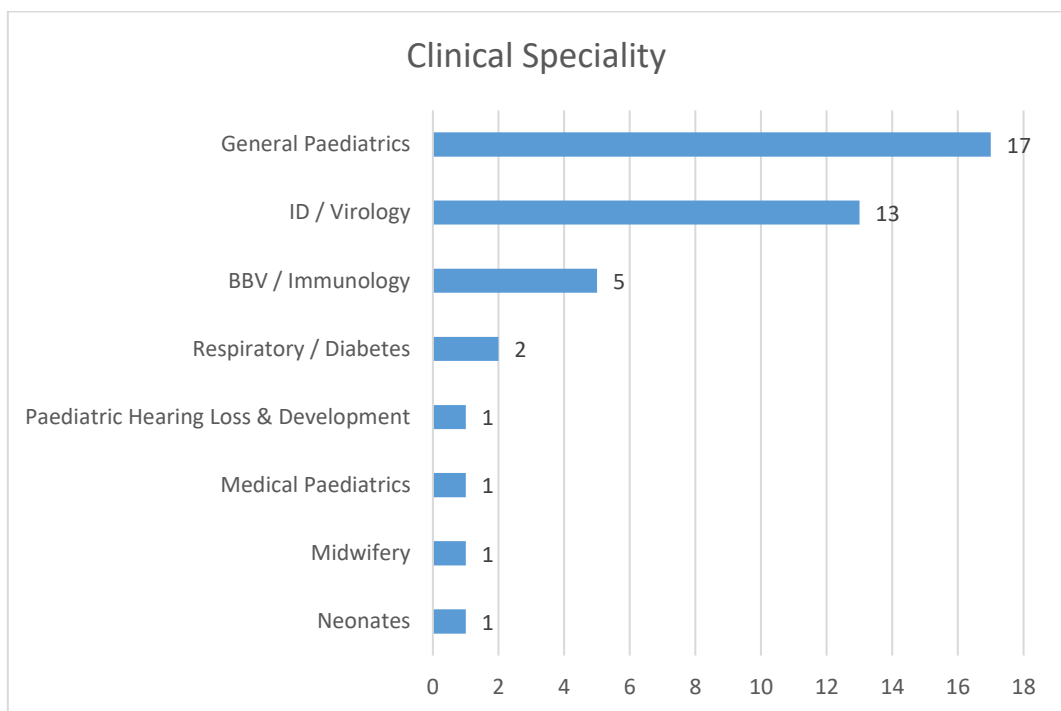
Some attendees shared the joining link with colleagues in meeting rooms, therefore, some attendees are unaccounted for (figures are approximate).

Total Number of Respondents	17 (35.4% response rate)

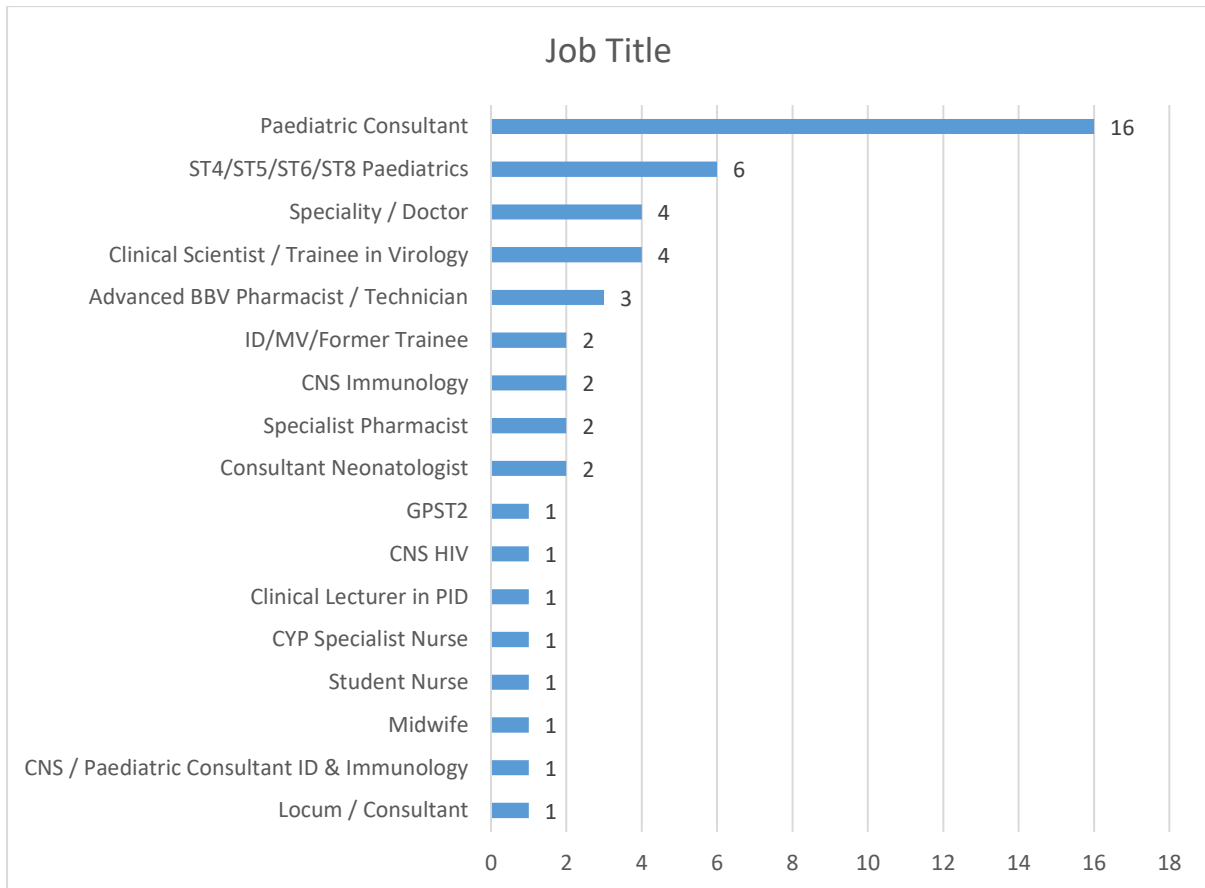




The table below demonstrates the various specialties in attendance.

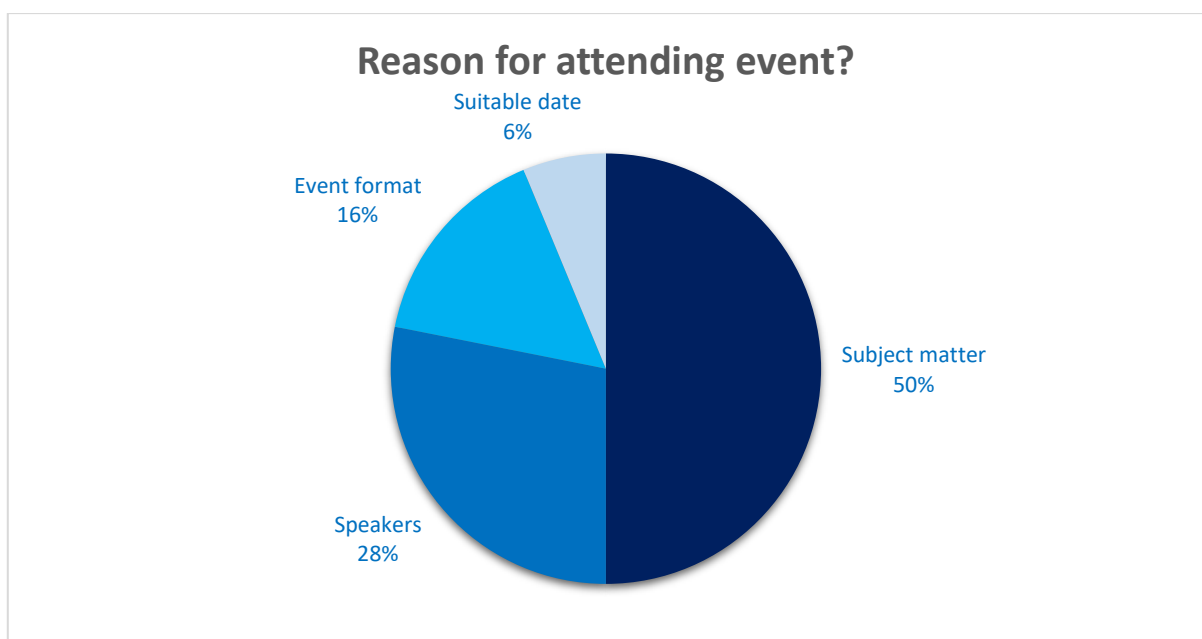


The table below demonstrates the job titles of those in attendance.



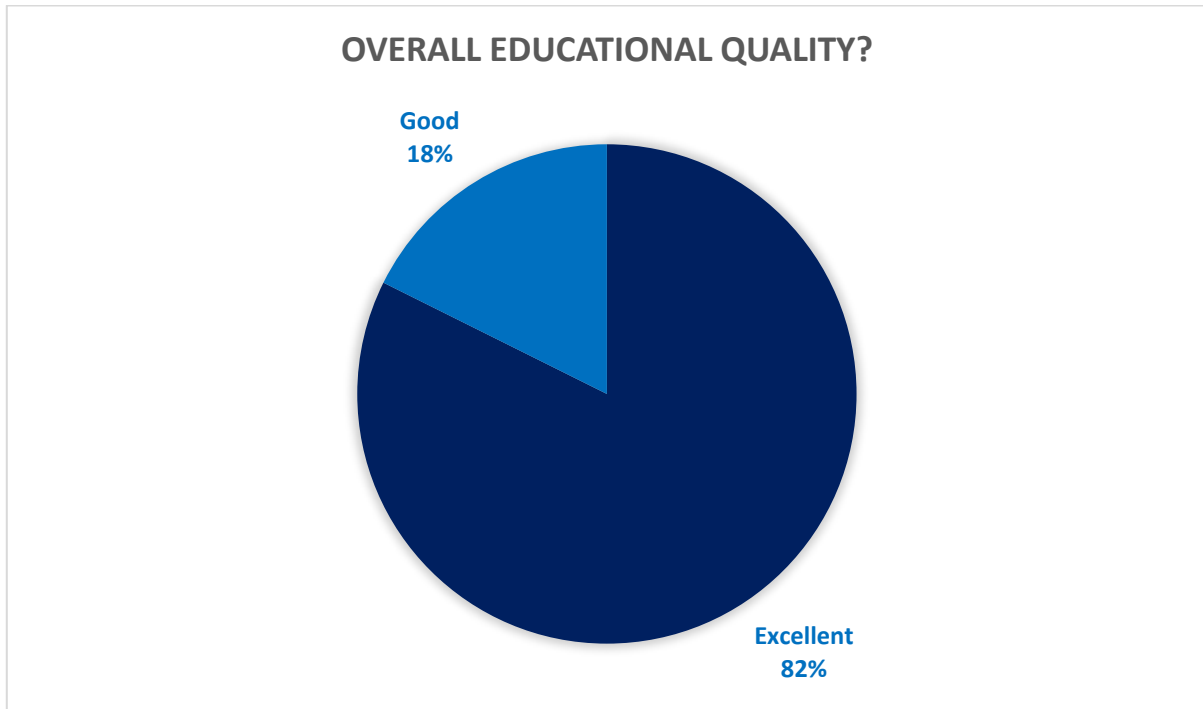
General Aspects of Event

Attendees were asked to rate their reason for attending, the results of which will enable the network to inform forward planning for future events.



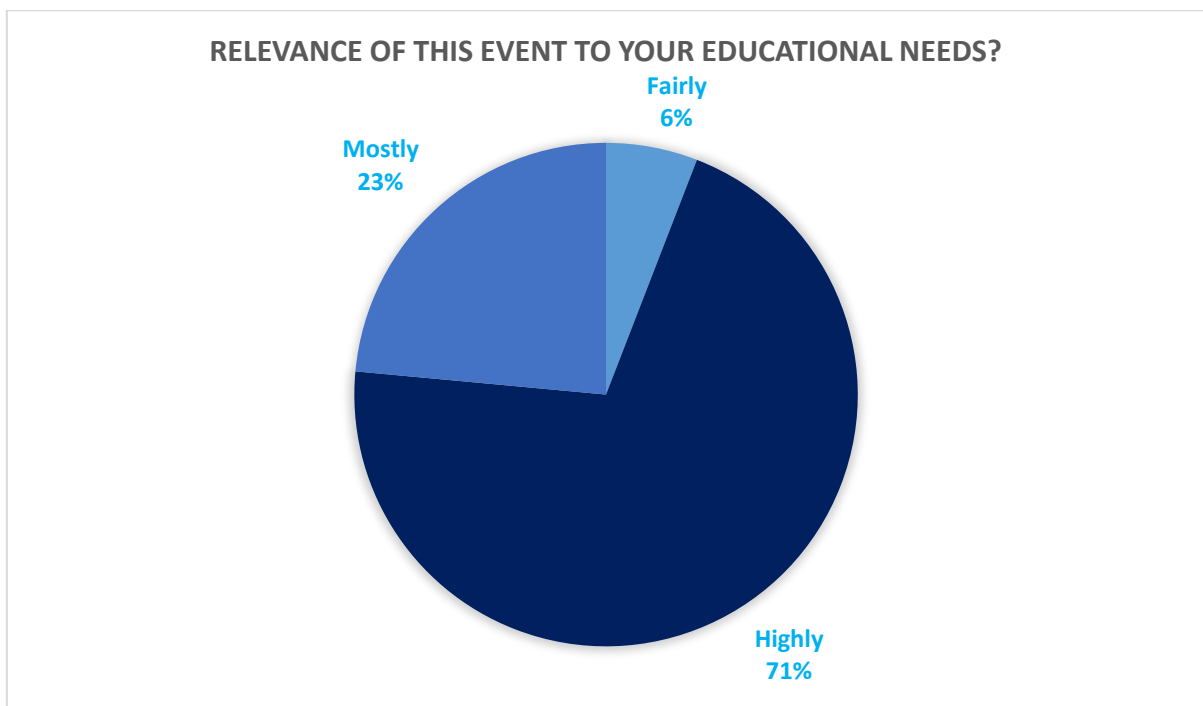
Quality of Overall Event

Attendees were asked to rate the overall quality of the event.

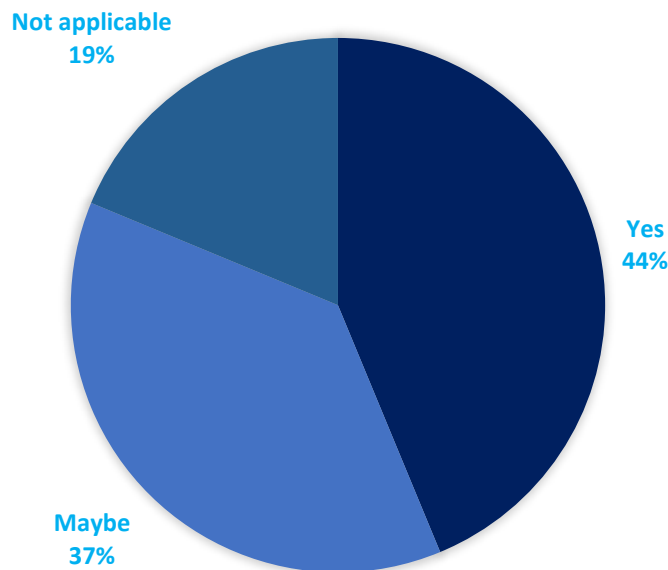


Effectiveness of Event

WILL THE PRESENTATIONS INFLUENCE YOUR FUTURE CLINICAL PRACTICE?



The 44% of respondents who answered 'Yes' were asked to clarify which areas of their clinical practice would be influenced by this event:

- Congenital CMV infection and the decision to treat when you have just an isolated Sign.
- Blood transfusion talk.
- Need to update practice with respect to transfusion special requirements for our PID cohort.
- New evidences and pathways discussed.

What did you like best about the event?

- "Very current and informative.
- CMV and blood transfusion talks.
- Opportunity to continue PDP despite current circumstances.
- Subjects of interest and relevance to General Paediatrics.
- Length of each talk not too long.
- Interesting and engaging speakers.
- Talk about congenital toxoplasmosis.

- Excellent speakers and good discussion around the topics.
- Variety of excellent speakers, wide variety of interesting topics.
- Getting reacquainted with rare diseases, hearing of other people's experiences".

How could events like this one be improved?

Below are comments received from attendees about how the event could be improved in the future. The results will inform the SPAIIN Steering Group on planning for such events, taking these comments into consideration.

Overall, delegates felt the day was very informative:

- “Continue virtual events to enable easier ability to attend.
- Improved IT support for speakers.
- More information relating to Covid-19 infection and vaccines.
- More case based discussions and how new pathways/evidences have changed the management.
- Encourage speakers from centres other than Glasgow to actively to participate.
- Would prefer face-to-face events when allowed.”
